Scholarships Available for Dighton, Somerset High School Seniors

Graduating seniors from Dighton or Somerset are urged to apply for two scholarships now available through the Community Foundation of Southeastern Massachusetts (CFSEMA).

For the following two scholarships, applications can be downloaded from the CFSEMA website, www.cfsema.org, or a paper copy can be obtained from the school guidance office. Scholarship applications must be postmarked by or delivered to the CFSEMA office, 63 Union Street, New Bedford, on the dates specified below:

The Frank D. Sylvia Trust Scholarship was established by Frank D. Sylvia to honor the memory of his late son, Frank P. Sylvia. It is limited to indigent deserving **Dighton or Somerset** students who plan to attend a college or university. The scholarship (up to \$9,000) is granted for one year only, although recipients may reapply annually. The criterion for selection will be weighted 75% on financial need, 25% on academics. . **Applications are due on April 10.**

The **Charles J. Lewin Interfaith Scholarship Fund** was established to provide scholarships to returning students and graduating high school seniors of **Barnstable, Bristol, Dukes and Plymouth counties**. The Fund provides several scholarships ranging from \$700 to \$3,800. Scholarships are granted for one year only, although recipients may reapply annually. The criterion for selection will be weighted 50% on financial need, 30% on academics and 20% on personal circumstances. **This is an online application process only, due on April 10.**
